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SELECTED NORM: English norm

SOCIAL LEADERSHIP
refers to the degree a person is
perceived as a leader.

As a leader, she will recognise that setbacks happen and that it will require effort to bounce back from difficult situations.

She will take the lead and be self-confident in social situations.

In her leadership, she will not compromise on success for principles and moral standards.

She will show good people skills through an empathetic and trusting attitude.

SOCIAL LEADERSHIP

As a leader, she will be ambitious and have a strong drive towards achievement of goals.

She will be persistent and conscientiously follow through with plans and projects.

By challenging the existing and taking the risks needed to execute, she will adapt and promote organisational change.

To deal with complexity, she will seek group learning and problem discussion.

refers to the guiding of activities
